WHAT SERVICES DOES THE CAREGIVER SUPPORT PROGRAM OFFER?

Information: Providing information to caregivers about available resources.

Assistance: Linking caregivers to available services (i.e. support groups).

Individual Counseling: Assisting caregivers in making decisions and solving problems relating to their caregiving roles.

Caregiver Training Sessions

Respite Care*: Providing caregivers a temporary break from their caregiving duties. Self-directed care option available; Caregiver chooses who provides them the respite care.

Supplemental Services*: Items or services designed to help “fill the gap” when there is a need or there are no other ways to obtain the service or item.

* On a Limited Basis

Each caregiver’s needs are individually determined after an in-depth assessment conducted by a member of the Family Caregiver Support Team.

SERVICES VARY IN EACH REGION

WHO DOES THIS PROGRAM SERVE?

The National Family Caregiver Support Program (NFCSP) offers support to the family members and friends that are caring for their loved ones.

CAREGIVERS ARE...

Adult family members or other informal caregivers age 18 and older

- ♦ providing care to individuals 60 years of age and older;
- ♦ providing care to individuals of any age with Alzheimer’s disease and related disorders;

Grandparents and other relatives (not parents) 55 years of age and older

- ♦ providing care to children under the age of 18; and
- ♦ providing care to adults age 18-59 with disabilities.

WHO PAYS FOR THE CAREGIVER SUPPORT PROGRAM?

The NFCSP is funded by Title III-E funds of the Federal Older Americans Act. It is operated in partnership with the CT State Department on Aging and the five Area Agencies on Aging.

A cost sharing fee is requested for Respite and Supplemental Services. The contribution is based on the cost of services and the care recipient’s monthly income. Please consider providing a contribution so that we can serve more caregivers.

Connecticut’s Area Agencies on Aging are private nonprofit organizations which serve the needs of older persons as a resource for information, program development and advocacy.
